Dear Chairman Hepford:

You inquire in your letter of February 6, 1974, whether I, as Chairman of the Pennsylvania Crime Commission, could furnish your Committee with a roster and facts concerning certain businesses referred to in a report of the Commission dated July 2, 1970. That report describes and names persons and businesses with reference to matters going back from 1969 to the early 50's. It even refers to pardons granted to alleged Cosa Nostra members by Governors Earle, Fine and Duff. Many names are given in the report. It is a fair assumption that other names may not have been set forth because of the absence of provable facts.

During my tenure as Attorney General I do not recall a single complaint or request for an investigation as to infiltration into legitimate business by criminal syndicates. I do not deny that such infiltration may exist, but I see no real value in the rehashing of the old matters referred to in the 1970 report. The 1971-72 report of the Commission dealt with only one situation in its discussion of criminal infiltration, i.e., a detailed story about the City Bank matter in Philadelphia.

There ought to be concern on your part and on my part in not releasing information which was a problem in the past and has not been shown to have any direct or indirect tie to a matter of present concern. There is always the problem of not violating the rights of innocent persons who unknowingly become associates in business with persons alleged to be part of organized crime.

As Chairman of the Pennsylvania Crime Commission I have no authority to release confidential matters, even though referred to in a report of the Commission. Disclosure can be authorized by a vote of the Commission. If you disagree with my personal view as to the disclosure of these very old matters and your Committee still wants disclosure made, please let me know and I shall take the matter up at the next meeting of the Commission.

As this is the Committee's first appearance in Philadelphia and we have found a rather surprising lack of understanding of our Committee's work and functions—although everyone has heard of you and the Committee—it would be suggested that in your opening statement you spend a little time going all the way back to HR 21 and possibly review some of the activities to date, such as:

- 1. Mention the Progress Report and perhaps some of its recommendations;
- 2. HB 1958 to implement the Pennsylvania Crime Commission recommendation;
- 3. \$9 million State Police "slush fund" and its follow-up of police related organizations' fund raising activities, particularly through professional solicitors;
