A public hearing of the Committee to Investigate the Administration of Justice was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Chairman H. Joseph Hepford pursuant to proper notice to Committee members.

The stated purpose of the hearing was to take the testimony of Lieutenant Angelo Carcaci and his wife, Catherine S. Carcaci. Both witnesses were accompanied by Attorney Morris Gerber and both refused to answer numerous questions from Committee Counsel and Committee members on "advice of counsel."

At this hearing, the Committee members voted unanimously to seek a contempt citation against Lieutenant Carcaci for refusing to answer questions on alleged wiretapping activities and his involvement in a "moonlighting" security system. The Committee also voted unanimously to release to the press copies of transcripts of executive sessions held on November 8, 14, and 28, 1973 concerning the Carcacis' security system or guard service.

The Committee also heard testimony of Robert Zinsky, Secretary-Treasurer, State Police Civic Association, at which time he made available unaudited financial reports of the Civic Association for the first three quarters of 1973. Mr. Zinsky was accompanied by Attorney John Sullivan.

The hearing was adjourned at 3:00 p.m.
