Effective this date, no staff member shall disclose to any non-official outside agency or individual, information concerning a subgrant application that is being processed through the Commission. Internal operations must remain confidential in order to ensure unrestricted staff input to applications. This ruling does not, of course, apply to "calendar questions", such as when a particular application will be appearing on the agenda of a Regional Council or the Commission.

The only documents which should be considered public record, and therefore open to public examination, are the actual subgrant application, regional council meeting minutes, and final action of the Governor's Justice Commission.
