SUBJECT: Historic Action by the Pennsylvania House of Representatives to Modernize the Commonwealth Budget Process

TO: All Opinion Leaders

This week in Harrisburg the Pennsylvania House of Representatives has taken an historic action to modernize and improve the Commonwealth's budgetary process for the first time in this century. This action has been taken at a time when the present process of preparation, formulation and action on the State budget has been clearly seen as a failure-- not only to the taxpayers of the State but to those who are dependent on State programs and services. By taking this historic step, at the initiation of House Republicans, an effort has begun to establish a new budget process which will:

- end the secrecy and closed-door nature in which the Governor's budget is formulated and presented to the General Assembly.
- end a budget process that is constantly in turmoil as each new State fiscal year begins.
- end a situation in which the executive branch is accountable to no one in how it expends appropriated funds.
- improve the efficiency and effectiveness by which the General Assembly considers, analyzes, and acts speedily on the budget.

This action has resulted from an increased recognition that "business as usual" in budget making was not assuring that the problems and needs of the taxpayers of the Commonwealth were being met through close legislative scrutiny of executive budget proposals and through the exercise of ongoing legislative oversight over executive expenditures of appropriated funds. These bills will help assure that both the executive and legislative branches formulate and pass a budget that is based on all available information, data, and a review of the performance under existing State programs and services. The enactment of this legislation by the Senate and its signature by the Governor will result in Governors in this State in the future, whatever their party, from withholding such basic information to the legislature as departmental budget requests, the assumptions upon which the Revenue Secretary's revenue estimates are based, and the criteria utilized in determining why the executive branch proposes to fund certain programs and not others.

In introducing these bills, I said, "The budgetary haggling of recent years has made it apparent to the citizens of the State that we suffer from a budget process that is archaic, closed, secret, and managed in a way more appropriate to the 1890's than the 1970's".

I am encouraged by this action of the House of Representatives that we in Pennsylvania may begin to catch up with the ongoing improvements in budget making that have occurred in the other States over several decades. To do this will require prompt and sustained support of these bills by both the Senate and the Governor. These bills provide a basis by which both the executive and legislative branches can more effectively debate and agree on constructive alternatives to meeting the needs of the Commonwealth with full knowledge of the facts and issues.

Today the General Assembly is looked upon by many in the executive branch as merely a "board of directors" to ratify whatever the executive branch proposes. Our constitutional framers recognized early in our history of the need for checks and balances and separation of powers. In so doing they established co-equal branches of government. In fact, however, with the rise of complex governmental programs, changes in the State budget format by the executive branch, and increases in gubernatorial powers, the General Assembly's role in enacting a budget has been severely hampered and restricted. This is contrary to the Legislature's responsibilities as a co-equal branch.

These bills re-establish the basis for constructive legislative involvement in budget making; at the same time they promote full utilization by the legislative branch of such budget tools as revenue estimating and performance auditing.

Pennsylvania is far behind the other States in the country in reforming and modernizing its budget process. Pennsylvania is one of only 21 States in which revenue estimates are prepared only by the executive branch; and one of only five States that have not established a date by which the Governor must submit his proposed budget. Forty-five States require either before or when the Governor's budget proposal is submitted to the Legislature that the Legislature receive all back-up data, departmental requests, and other budgetary materials used in its preparation, but not in Pennsylvania. But these bills which passed the House this week would place Pennsylvania in the forefront of the States in budget making and remedy such deficiencies where Pennsylvania lags behind the other States.

These bills, upon enactment, would not take effect until December 1, 1974 to avoid any charges that partisan considerations were involved in the initiation of these reforms. A brief analysis of the content of each of these bills is attached:

BUDGET MODERNIZATION LEGISLATION

CONSIDERED BY THE PENNSYLVANIA GENERAL ASSEMBLY 1973-74

A Review and Commentary

A series of bills were introduced in the Pennsylvania House of Representatives for improving the budget process in Pennsylvania. Some of the reasons for these bills are:

1. A chaotic budget process -- Nine out of the last twelve years have been without budget passage by June 30.
2. The secrecy and closed-door nature in which the Governor's budget is proposed -- The Legislature has not received all the necessary data and information from which to consider and act on a budget.
3. A need to increase the accountability of Executive to Legislative branch in execution of programs and expending of funds -- The Legislature does not have the capability to determine whether programs and services for which funds have been appropriated are worthwhile and effective.
4. A need to improve the Legislature's ability to act speedily on the budget and exercise its oversight responsibilities.

Pennsylvania's budget process does not provide for many of the activities found in other states.

- - In 27 states, revenue estimates are prepared by both Legislative and Executive branches.
- - In 45 states, a specific date has been established by which the Governor must submit his proposed budget.
- - In 44 states, the Governor is required either before or when the Governor's budget proposal is submitted to the Legislature to provide that the Legislature receive all back-up data, departmental requests, and other budgetary matter also used in its preparation.
- - In 33 states, there are legislative postauditors.

In June, 1974, The House of Representatives passed and sent to the Senate five bills to place Pennsylvania's budget process in a position to handle the complex issues of the 20th century. These bills remain in committees of the State Senate.

HOUSE BILL 1990, P.N. 3040; 6/4/74 (103-74). Establishing a process and procedure for expressing legislative intent in the spending of State funds (Legislative Oversight Act).

1. Permits an Advisory Letter of Intent be sent to the Governor on final passage of the budget.
2. Permits specification of legislative intent for each budget item as to priorities, objectives, administration, etc.
3. Requires that the Governor indicate in writing to the General Assembly with supporting rationale when, at any time, he will not follow this legislative intent.

HOUSE BILL 1990, P.N. 3040; 6/4/74 (103-74). An act establishing a process for legislative intent.

PROS

1. Better assist legislative postauditor and Auditor General in conducting their audits.
2. Clarify in one document legislative intent.
3. Assures accountability by Executive branch to the Legislature.
4. Less discretion for the Governor in policy matters over expenditures of State funds.

CONS

1. Is only advisory and not binding on Governor.
2. Requires agreement between both Houses before can be sent.
3. Intrudes on Executive branch prerogatives.
4. Can be better expressed in general appropriations bill.

1. The Legislative basis for the Legislature to prepare its own revenue estimates.
2. Responsibility for preparing the Legislature's revenue estimates to the proposed Joint Committee on Performance Audit Review (H.B. 1994).
3. That the Governor send to the General Assembly all information, assumptions, data, and other materials used by the Executive branch to formulate revenue estimates.

2. Assures that the Governor does not underestimate revenue to reduce legislative discretion nor overestimates to enable his programs to be passed and funded.
3. Provides for earlier and direct Legislative involvement in revenue determinations.
4. Provides for periodic updating of estimates.

CONS

1. Intrudes on Executive's budget-making powers.
2. May result in more chaotic budget process involving revenues as well as expenditures.
3. Raises constitutional questions of whose revenue estimates are to be used.

HOUSE BILL 1992, P.N. 3042; Approved 6/6/74 (115-63) An act providing for access of the General Assembly to information of the Executive branch relating to preparation of the budget.

This bill provides that:

1. All budget estimates, back-up data used in budget preparation be submitted to the Governor and the Legislature simultaneously.
2. Members of the Legislature be permitted to set in on all Executive budget hearings.
3. Governor must submit his budget ten days after the initial session of the Legislature and 45 days when Governor-elect takes office.
4. Legislative committees receive all information on request from the Executive.

An Act providing for access of the General Assembly to information of the executive branch relating to preparation of the budget; and enforcement of subpoenas; and providing for confidentiality of certain information.

HOUSE BILL 1993, P.N. 2663; Approved 6/5/74. An act amending the Administrative Code providing for the continuance of the general appropriation act of the preceeding year in event that a new general appropriation act is not enacted by July 1.

This bill provides that:

1. The level of expenditures provided under the general appropriations budget for the previous year remain in effect until a new budget is adopted.
2. Revenues generated in the fiscal year beginning after June 30 be used to continue to fund services at the same level as the previous year.
3. Permits actual spending amounts to reflect past spending variations, e.g., programs requiring higher expenditures in the summer would continue at that level.

Printer's No. 3292.

An Act amending "The Administrative Code of 1929," approved April 9, 1929 (P. L. 177, No. 175), providing for the continuance of the general appropriation act of the preceeding year in event that a new general appropriation act is not enacted by July first.

HOUSE BILL 1993, P.N. 2663; Butera amendment, 6/5/74. An act amending the Administrative Code providing for the continuance of the general appropriations act of the preceeding year. Clarifies constitutionality questions.

The amendment would:

1. Require the Governor to certify the availability of revenue and surplus for the ensuing fiscal year.
2. Require that if a general appropriations act has not been passed ten days prior to the beginning of the new fiscal year, the Governor publicly state the details of the continuing budget with certification of revenues.
3. Establish that appropriations authorized remain in effect until enactment of a new general appropriations act.

HOUSE BILL 1993, P.N. 2663; Butera amendment, 6/5/74 (142-37-20).

PROS

1. Provides language to overcome constitutional questions.
2. Puts all persons on notice as to the contents of the prior general appropriations bill.
3. Encourages enactment of appropriation legislation.

CONS

1. State Treasurer may refuse to issue checks claiming insufficient authority to make disbursements.
2. Use of future years revenues without specific language in present budget is questionable.

HOUSE BILL 1994, P.N. 3047; Fineman amendment number 1, 6/5/74. An act creating the Joint Committee on Performance Audit Review.

This amendment would:

1. Remove language permitting the Joint Committee members to designate certain positions under the Legislative postauditor wherein candidates for said positions must be approved by the members prior to appointment or dismissal.
2. Eliminate a third standard of qualification for the position of Legislative Postauditor permitting "equivalent experience".

HOUSE BILL 1994, P.N. 3047; Fineman amendment number 1, 6/5/74 (91-93-15).

PROS

1. Assure control by Legislative Postauditor over all positions on his staff.
2. Limits the qualifications of candidates for Legislative Postauditor to those with stipulated credentials; to limit political intrusion.

CONS

1. Permits the Joint Committee the power, if desired, to have a say in appointing the Directors of the two divisions of the office (long range budgetary analysis and performance postauditing).
2. The types of qualifications for Legislative Postauditor may be met through an equivalent combination of training and experience assuring that the most competent individual is selected.

HOUSE BILL 1994, P.N. 3047; Fineman amendment number two, 6/5/74. (80-104-15).
 An act creating the Joint Committee on Performance Audit Review. This amendment would increase the level of appropriations for the Joint Committee from \$500,000 to \$1,000,000.

PROS

1. Complexity and scope of duties of Legislative Postauditor require additional financial support.

CONS

1. The act would not take effect until December 1, leaving only one-half of the fiscal year left for its operations.
 2. Initial organization and experience with this set-up will enable a better determination to be made of the amount of appropriations required.

HOUSE BILL 1994, P.N. 3047; Englehart amendment. An act creating the Joint Committee on Performance Audit Review. This amendment would substitute the language of Senate Bill 1509 (Kury Bill) which would further regulate the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee.

This amendment would:

1. Permit the Committee to perform financial and management as well as performance audits.
2. Have composition of Committee from the General Assembly rather than just leadership.
3. Permit postaudits of only state activities.
4. Specify that the director shall be a professional without any qualifications stated.
5. Permits meetings to be held in private.
6. Give broad, vague, and non-specific duties to the Committee without provision for procedures by which audits should be conducted.

HOUSE BILL 1994, P.N. 3047; Englehart amendment.

PROS

1. Limits the power of the director to conduct audits only with supervision of the Committee.
2. Limits auditoes to only state government and not political subdivisions.
3. Eliminates advisory nominating panel.

CONS

1. Permits political intrusion into the independence and objectivity of performance auditing.
2. Combining all audits will result in few performance audits.
3. Establishes practices and procedures to permit audited agencies to comment on findings before made public and for the Postauditor to follow up within 90 days on compliance with findings.

VOTE: The Englehart amendment was defeated by a voice vote.

HOUSE BILL 1994, P.N. 3047; Bennett amendment. An act creating the Joint Committee on Performance Audit Review. Permits use of the subpoena power only by Legislative Postauditor with approval of a majority of Joint Committee.

PROS

1. Power of subpoena should be used with discretion and with the approval of the elected members of the General Assembly.

CONS

1. May limit the speedy and effective conduct of performance postaudits.

VOTE: The Bennett amendment was approved on a voice vote.

HOUSE BILL 1994, P.N. 3047; Mullen, M. amendment 6/5/74. An act creating the Joint Committee on Performance Audit Review.

This amendment would:

1. Remove any stated qualifications for selection of Legislative Postauditor.
2. Permit Joint Committee to select any person for the position of Legislative Postauditor.
3. Remove language that establishes that the Office of Legislative Postauditor shall take precedence over any conflicting part of application of any other law.

HOUSE BILL 1994, P.N. 3047; Mullen, M. amendment, 6/5/74 (59-126-14).

PROS

1. Gives Joint Committee total control and power over the conduct and activities of Legislative Postauditor.
2. Permits any type of person to fill the position.

CONS

1. Permits the hiring of unqualified persons to fill a technically sophisticated position.
2. Permits political intrusion into the integrity and objectivity of conducting performance postaudits.

4. Helps to determine the management inefficiency and program effectiveness of state-funded activities.
5. Assures that these audits are carried out objectively and without fear of censure.

CONS

1. Establishes a legislative czar with the power to examine any state activity.
2. Isolates the legislative postaudit function too much from the political process.
3. Requires considerable financial support and the hiring of highly-trained and well-paid qualified staff.
