

24 Section 305. Funding of projects.

25 The projects itemized in this chapter shall be funded from a
26 portion of existing interest earnings held by the Commonwealth
27 Financing Authority established under 64 Pa.C.S. Ch. 15
28 (relating to Commonwealth Financing Authority).

29 Section 306. Transfer and appropriations.

30 Notwithstanding the provisions of 64 Pa.C.S. Ch. 15 Subchs. B
31 (relating to structure and powers) and C (relating to bonds),
32 interest earnings held by the Commonwealth Financing Authority
33 in an amount not exceeding \$6,171,000 shall be transferred to
34 the Capital Facilities Fund and appropriated to the Department
35 of General Services to be used by it exclusively to defray the
36 financial cost of the projects specifically itemized in this
37 chapter.

38 Section 307. Federal funds.

39 All moneys received from the Federal Government for the
40 projects specifically itemized in this chapter are also hereby
41 appropriated for those projects.

42 Section 308. Construction.

43 (a) Amounts contained in this chapter for any project shall
44 not supplant or replace any Federal funds authorized by any
45 Federal law or regulation. Funding from this chapter for any
46 project is available only to the extent that Federal funds are
47 not available for such project.

48 (b) Projects which are itemized in this chapter are deemed
49 to be flood mitigation projects for purposes of and funding
50 under Chapter 5 to the extent that the projects qualify under
51 The Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance

1 Act (Public Law 93-288, 88 Stat. 143).

2 CHAPTER 5

3 DISASTER MITIGATION AND ASSISTANCE PROJECTS

4 Section 501. Scope.

5 This chapter relates to disaster mitigation and assistance
6 projects itemization in 2012.

7 Section 502. Definitions.

8 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
9 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
10 context clearly indicates otherwise:

11 "Disaster." The period of time in calendar year 2011
12 relating to Hurricane Irene and Tropical Storm Lee that was the
13 subject of a Presidential declaration of an emergency under The
14 Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act
15 (Public Law 93-288, 88 Stat. 143).

16 Section 503. Total authorization.

17 The total authorization for disaster mitigation projects or
18 public assistance projects as defined in The Robert T. Stafford
19 Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (Public Law 93-288,
20 88 Stat. 143) or as a project qualifying for assistance by the
21 United States Army Corps of Engineers and to be financed in part
22 with grants limited to the required match for the Federal share
23 of the costs made to local political subdivisions or nonprofit
24 organizations where applicable as itemized in this chapter is
25 \$61,743,000. Projects for which no Federal funds are received
26 shall not receive funding under this chapter.

27 Section 504. Itemization of disaster mitigation or assistance
28 projects.

29 The individual disaster mitigation or assistance projects to
30 be funded as specified in section 516 are hereby itemized,
31 together with their respective estimated financial costs, in
32 this chapter.

17 provisions of this act. It is hereby declared as the legislative
18 intent that this act would have been adopted had such
19 unconstitutional provisions not been included in this act.

20 Section 702. Effective date.

21 This act shall take effect immediately.
