



House promotes Old Economy Village, Logstown-Legion Ville historical areas

HARRISBURG, Dec. 7 -- The Pennsylvania House of Representatives is asking the United States Postal Service to memorialize two historical areas in the 16th Legislative District as commemorative stamps.

State Rep. Susan Laughlin, D-Beaver/Allegheny, introduced resolutions asking the Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee to recommend commemorating Old Economy Village and Logstown-Legion Ville historical areas on U.S. postage stamps. The House unanimously adopted both resolutions earlier this week.

"Logstown-Legion Ville and Old Economy Village are important pieces not only of the Commonwealth's history but also the history of our nation," said Laughlin. "Our history with Logstown-Legion Ville dates as far back as the French and Indian War, while the Harmonists of Old Economy Village in the early 1800s created a prototype of our modern-day economy."

Logstown was a key trading post for French and English traders and Native Americans. The site later became the location of Legion Ville, a camp where Major General "Mad" Anthony Wayne, under the orders of President George Washington, trained his fighting force to subject the Northwest Territory.

"Okenomie" as Old Economy Village in Ambridge was first called, was the site of a 600-member German Christian communal society known as the Harmony Society. This society valued agriculture and industry equally, which enabled the early American economy to grow into what it is today.

"Both of these historic sites contribute to the greater understanding our state and nation. The two areas already receive visitors, but recognizing these national historic areas on stamps further would promote the contributions this Commonwealth has made to our history and would foster Pennsylvania's tourism industry," Laughlin said.

Stamp subjects are developed from the suggestions of the Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee on behalf of the U.S. Postal Service. The committee reviews all stamp subjects and makes its recommendations for future stamps to the postmaster general.

Both resolutions (H.R.s 335 and 336) will be transmitted to the stamp advisory committee for its consideration.

In accordance with our recent conversation regarding the feldspar stone monument, I would like to call your attention to a presentation that you were part of last year in Harrisburg made to the Department of Transportation.

If you recall from that presentation, there was before and after photos of the monument located on Jerart's property. Everyone complimented Jerart on the restoration work that it had performed on the monument. If it is your desire, I can send you these before and after photos for your file.

Rest assured that Jerart intends to clean, in accordance with restoration specifications, the stone and to care for it in its temporary location and will provide care when it is moved to its permanent location in the Logstown/Legionville Historical Park & Center.

As additional information for you, when Jerart sold a parcel of land and buildings, Jerart did not sell the feldspar stone and maintained ownership of that stone. This sale of the land and buildings occurred years ago. It was just recently that we moved the stone to its temporary location so that we could oversee the restoration work that will be done on the stone.

In any event, thank you for the call in reference to the stone.
