In reference to your recent letter concerning House Bill 1560, I would like to inform you that this legislation has been referred to the House Local Government Committee. As well, I would like to point out that the State Veterans Commission and the State War Veterans Council have both agreed to work with the committee to ensure that the legislation does not financially burden the county veterans affairs offices. In short, I would agree that there needs to be some further consensus on the definition of a "veteran," thus, I will continue to work with the pertinent interested parties on this important matter.

In terms of flags on Gold Star Mothers' graves, the State Veterans Commission, who initiated the language for my bill, is also examining the feasibility of establishing a flag and grave marker for this particular group. This measure was not covered in my bill, but I would be receptive to the idea per the State Veterans Commission recommendation on this matter.

We are writing to you with regard to our concerns about House Bill 1560. This Bill, as written, will create three new entitlement classes for benefits under the County Code of Pennsylvania. The legislation creating these new entitlement groups does not create any funding sources from the Commonwealth to assist us in paying either the direct costs of this program or to assist us with the administrative overhead.

Centre County has approximately 12,000 residents who are veterans of whom approximately 70 percent are potentially eligible under the current law. If House Bill 1560 is passed, as written, the County will have to increase its funding of this program by at least 30 percent to cover just the Peace Time veterans; if Reservists and National Guardsman are included, the increase in funding could be substantial. It should also be noted that by Federal regulations, Reservists and Guardsman are not considered to be veterans and are not eligible for most Federal programs unless they have had active service.

We are concerned that the passing of this Bill, as written, and its creation of additional unfunded mandates would put further stress on our already strained budget. Not only would this legislation force us to increase the number of flags we purchase each year, but the County would also have to bear the expense of expanded administrative costs and staffing.

Section 1922 (b.1) might be reasonable in the counties in the southern section of the Commonwealth but in Centre County's northern areas we frequently have severe inclement weather by Veterans Day. By restricting Cemetary Associations in this way, the legislation puts increased burdens on them which further complicates their already difficult job.

Our concerns also revolve around Section 1922 (d). We wonder if this section is necessary in light of a system that primarily depends on volunteers. In addition, it is unclear as to why the County is to be notified. The legislation does not clearly explain what our responsibilities are with regard to these notifications.

Any assistance you can provide in proventing yet another unfunded mandate would be greatly appreciated. Thank you for your support and please do not hesitate to call should you have any questions.
