Re: Proposed Legislation - Requiring Municipal Level Approval of Sewage Sludge Land - Applications (formerly House Bill 1562)

I plan to reintroduce legislation that would require the approval of the local governing body of a municipality prior to the application of sewage sludge on land within the jurisdiction of a municipality.

During the past year, several municipalities and numerous residents in my legislative district have expressed their strong opposition to a permit application for the agricultural utilization of biosolids on land which contained several serious deficiencies that would result in a potential threat to the groundwater quality in the area. Initial efforts by the local governing bodies and residents to demonstrate to the DEP that the proposed sites contain unsuitable soils for the spray irrigation of wastewater effluent, permeable limestone conditions prone to develop sinkholes, were not well received by the department's soil scientists.

Local farming operations increasingly cooperate in the nutrient management planning programs with the Soil Conservation District and local municipal governments and municipal water and wastewater authorities are making consistent efforts and expending increasing funds to reduce and dispose of the detrimental elements and compounds in the soils and groundwater. Therefore, it is appropriate for the local governing body to have the authority to approve such applications.
