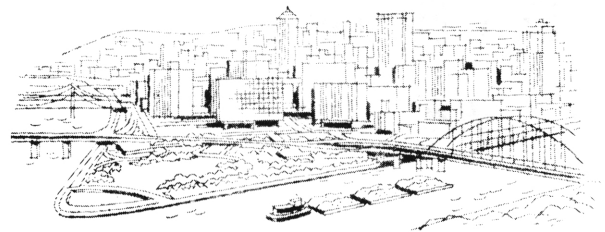


Dear Representative Kelly:

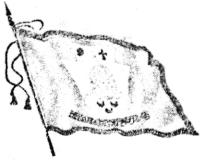

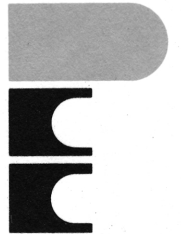

Dear Mr. Kelly:

The action of the House majority in fighting for permanent and meaningful tax relief, which resulted in H.B. 1129 becoming law on March 13, is to be commended.

I know that the Pennsylvania business community is grateful for your role in the enactment of this legislation. It will contribute significantly to making the Commonwealth a better place in which to do business.

There are, however, other problems still confronting the Commonwealth that must be solved if we are to have a fully competitive business environment. Consider the following facts:

The first billion dollar General Fund budget for the State was approved 12 years ago. In 12 years, this budget has gone up 400%. During the same period, the cost of living increased about 50%, and the per capita personal income of Pennsylvanians increased less than 100%. In other words, the cost of government increased 8 times as fast as the cost of living and 4 times as fast as the increase in per capita personal income.

Effective measures must be taken to control the increasing cost of government. In our opinion, two areas in which substantial savings can be realized by prompt legislative action are 1) implementation of the Governor's Review of Government Management, and 2) welfare reform.

If government spending is not controlled, taxes will inevitably rise and the Commonwealth's economy will suffer. I urge you to continue your fine efforts toward making Pennsylvania economically competitive with other states by pressing for greater economies in government.




In the Fall of 1972, I requested your support of proposed legislation which would permit the City of Philadelphia to issue "revenue" bonds in lieu of "general obligation" bonds to finance certain self-sustaining projects. I justified my request on the grounds that the enactment of such legislation could have a two-fold benefit: First, revenue bonds might receive a higher credit rating than general obligation bonds and therefore demand a lower interest rate; and, secondly, in the long run, the credit rating on general obligation bonds might tend to improve because lesser amounts of that type of bond would have to be issued. The proposed legislation was approved unanimously by both the Senate and the House and became Act No. 234 of 1972.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you on behalf of the City of Philadelphia for your support of Act No. 234. We are in the final stages of marketing the first issue of revenue bonds. These bonds have received an "A" rating, which means that the interest to be paid on them will be about 10% lower than the interest which would have been payable on a similar general obligation issue in view of our present general obligation bond credit rating.

It may be some time before the use of revenue bonds results in an improvement of our general obligation bond credit rating but we fully expect that anticipated secondary benefit of Act No. 234 be realized at some future date.

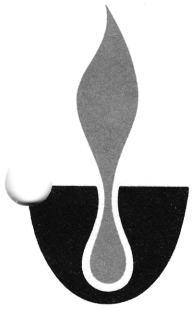

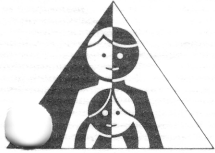
