Dear Mr. Geist:

I am writing to advise you that PennDOT will be implementing revisions to its license plate program later this summer. We will implement a new program called a "Specialty Plate" program which will allow organizations and other non-profit groups to qualify for graphic design plates to promote their interests.

The Specialty Plate program will bring all newly requested plates into what we are calling the "Family of Pennsylvania" plates. Organizations will be able to work with PennDOT and Correctional Industries to design their logo on the left side of the plate using color. All other parts of the plate canvas will be the standard plate colors of blue and yellow. This change will allow non-profit organizations to advocate their interests, will allow them to charge a fee above the \$20.00 PennDOT fee and provides for a distinctive looking plate.

PennDOT has listened to your interests regarding the need to address full canvas Special Fund Plates. I believe this direction will serve the interests of your constituents, address law enforcement concerns and improve administrative efficiencies for PennDOT.

As well, PennDOT will realize a cost savings/cost avoidance of about \$20,000 in inventory and staff time for each Specialty Plate developed in comparison to processing Special Fund Plates. There also is the potential for this program to generate revenue as organizations consider replacing current plates using a more colorful logo and new organizations become interested in the program.

The specifics of the Specialty Plate program are highlighted on the attached fact sheet. We have also forwarded an outline of the process that will be communicated to the organizations who express an interest and a timeline for implementation.

Deputy Secretary Betty Serian is planning a meeting to further brief you and your staff on this program. In cooperation with the Department of Corrections, Correctional Industries staff, Betty is also scheduling a tour for you and your staff of the prison in Mercer County to see the new graphic sheeting process in operation.

SPECIALTY PLATE PROGRAM **FACT SHEET**

PLATE DESIGN

Standard "Family of Pennsylvania" plate colors of blue and yellow with "PENNSYLVANIA" printed on top of plate (blue section).

3" by 3" canvas area on left side of plate for organization to use to display emblem or logo. Canvas will be graphically printed featuring color and allowing for artistic flexibility and intricacy of design.

Stacked letters prefix unique to organization to assist with plate identification.

Organization name or approved slogan printed on bottom of plate (yellow section).

PROGRAM CRITERIA

In order for an organization to qualify for the Specialty Plate Program. it must:

✓ Be a Non-profit organization:

✓ Have as one of its primary purposes, services to the community, which results in a contribution to the welfare of others:

✓ Be based, headquartered, or have a chapter in Pennsylvania;

✓ Not be offensive in purpose, nature, activity or name, as determined by the Department;

✓ Guarantee a minimum of applications (negotiable) before any plate will be produced.

PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS

Program "kits" developed and provided by PennDOT to interested organizations upon request.

"Kits" provide eligibility criteria, guidelines for program participation and items required to be submitted for consideration.

All applications reviewed by PennDOT.

PROGRAM COSTS FOR ORGANIZATION

Organization works with Correctional Industries to purchase design services and plates.

Design services which include print proof and production of sample plates anticipated to be approximately \$500.

Plate production anticipated to be approximately \$2.50 per plate. Plates will be produced on a "just in time" system--organization will pay for plate inventory that they determine.

PROGRAM BENEFITS

Standardizes plate appearance by conforming to "Family of Pennsylvania" plate colors and layout while providing a colorful and attractive plate for organizations to sell and promote their interest.

Eliminates PennDOT and Correctional Industries costs for plate design, plate production, plate inventory and administrative responsibilities (approximately \$20,000 for a Special Fund-like plate and approximately \$3,000 for a Special Organization-like plate).

Eliminates PennDOT collection and transferring of fees designated to organizational funds.

Allows organizations to advertise, solicit and collect funds directly from eligible customers with no limitation on the amount an organization may charge its customers above the \$20 PennDOT fee.

COMMUNICATION TO CURRENT ORGANIZATIONS

PennDOT will advise current Special Organization Plate program participants of the new Specialty Plate Program providing them the opportunity for change.

On-going outreach to our existing Special Fund Plate program participants to prepare them for conversion to the new Specialty Plate design format upon depletion of their current plate stock.

Offer to the existing Special Organizations and Special Funds the opportunity to purchase their remaining inventory, at cost, in order to expedite conversion to the new Specialty Plate design format.

IMPLEMENTATION TIMEFRAME

- Program "kits" finalized and available in June, 2004.
- Rollout of new Specialty Plates in July/August, 2004.
