PENNSYLVANIA'S 300TH BIRTHDAY 1981

FRIENDS --

TODAY WE HAVE COME HERE FOR A CELEBRATION....A CELEBRATION OF

PENNSYLVANIA'S 300TH BIRTHDAY.....A CELEBRATION OF FRIENDS. THE

EMBLEM FOR THIS YEAR'S FESTIVITIES DEPICTS THE OUTLINE OF PENNSYLVANIA

AS TWO HANDS CLASPED IN FRIENDSHIP. BUT WHAT DOES FRIENDSHIP REALLY

HAVE TO DO WITH HISTORY OR, FOR THAT MATTER, GOVERNMENT?

WHEN I ASKED MYSELF THIS QUESTION, I DECIDED TO CONSULT THE DICTIONARY FOR A DEFINITION OF "FRIEND". I FOUND AN INTERESTING FACT. TRACING FRIEND BACK TO ITS INDO-EUROPEAN BASE, I FOUND IT MEANT "FREE". FREEDOM HAS A LOT TO DO WITH PENNSYLVANIA.

ON MARCH 4, 1681, KING CHARLES II SIGNED A CHARTER GRANTING

A TRACT OF LAND, FOUR TIMES THE SIZE OF NETHERLANDS, TO RID HIMSELF

OF A TROUBLESOME SUBJECT. NOT EXACTLY A FRIENDLY ACT, YET IT

WAS THIS ACT WHICH MADE TODAY'S CELEBRATION POSSIBLE. PENN USED

THE LAND FOR A "HOLY EXPERIMENT" IN FREEDOM.

WITHIN A MONTH OF RECEIVING THE CHARTER, PENN ISSUED A LETTER TO THE SETTLERS SAYING:

"I HOPE YOU WILL NOT BE TROUBLED WITH YOUR CHANGE
AND THE KING'S CHOICE; FOR YOU ARE NOW FIXT, AT
THE MERCY OF NO GOVERNOR THAT COMES TO MAKE HIS
FORTUNE GREAT. YOU SHALL BE GOVERNED BY LAWS
OF YOUR OWN MAKING AND LIVE FREE...."

NEXT PENN BEGAN WORKING DILIGENTLY TO FORM A FRIENDSHIP WITH
THE INDIANS IN THE REGION. BY JULY HE PUBLISHED PROVISIONS TO
"THOSE WHO MAY BECOME ADVENTURES AND PURACHSERS" IN THE PROVIDENCE.

THESE PROVISIONS REQUIRED SETTLERS TO TRADE WITH THE INDIANS OPENLY
AND FAIRLY AND TO TREAT THE INDIANS EXACTLY AS THEY WOULD OTHER

SETTLERS. THE PROVISIONS ALSO STATED THAT ANY DIFFERENCES BETWEEN
THE INDIANS AND THE SETTLERS WERE TO BE SETTLED BY A GROUP CONSISTING
OF SIX SETTLERS AND SIX INDIANS. ON DECEMBER 24, 1682, PENN SIGNED
THE TREATY OF AMNITY WHICH CEMENTED THE GOODWILL BETWEEN THE SETTLERS
AND THE INDIANS.

PENN'S PRIMARY CONCERN WAS RELIGIOUS FREEDOM, FOR IT WAS HIS

EFFORTS TO FREE THE QUAKER SOCIETY OF FRIENDS FROM PERSECUTION THAT

LANDED HIM IN PRISON FOUR TIMES AND EVENTUALLY RESULTED IN THE KING'S

GRANTING OF THE CHARTER. HIS VISION OF FREEDOM, HOWEVER, EXTENDED TO GOVERNMENT ALSO.

"GOVERNMENT SEEMS TO ME A PART OF RELIGION ITSELF,
A THING SACRED IN ITS INSTITUTIONS AND ENDS. ANY
GOVERNMENT IS FREE TO THE PEOPLE UNDER IT, WHATEVER
THE FRAME, WHERE THE LAWS RULE AND THE PEOPLE ARE
PARTY TO THOSE LAWS."

THE FIRST ASSEMBLY MET AT CHESTER ON DECEMBER 14, 1682. THE FRAME OF GOVERNMENT DESIGNED BY PENN WAS TO CONSIST OF A PROVINICAL COUNCIL OF 72 MEMBERS, ANALOGOUS TO THE GOVERNOR'S CABINET, AND AN ASSEMBLY OF 200 MEMBERS. THE MEMBERS WERE TO BE CHOSEN BY FREE MEN AND COULD NOT SERVE FOR MORE THAN THREE YEARS.

BY THE FIRST ACTUAL SESSION OF THE ASSEMBLY, HELD IN

PHILADELPHIA, THE NUMBER OF MEMBERS WAS REDUCED TO 18 FOR COUNCIL

AND 36 FOR THE ASSEMBLY BECAUSE IT WAS TOO DIFFICULT AND COSTLY FOR

THE LAWMAKERS TO TRAVEL TO THE MEETINGS. VOTES WERE TAKEN BY

DROPPING BEANS INTO A BOX.

PENNSYLVANIA'S HAVE ALWAYS BEEN TENACIOUS PEOPLE, AND SO

THE COLONIAL ASSEMBLYMEN WERE NOT DAUNTED BY THE LACK OF A

MEETING PLACE. THEY OFTEN MET IN PRIVATE HOMES, SCHOOL HOUSES

AND EVEN IN MEMBER'S BEDROOMS WHEN NECESSARY. FOR EXAMPLE, DURING

THE SPEAKERSHIP OF ISSAC NORRIS, THE ASSEMBLY RETIRED TO NORRIS'

BEDROOM WHEN HE WAS STRICKEN WITH GOUT. ANOTHER TIME, LACKING A

QUORUM, THE ASSEMBLY WENT TO THOMAS MASTER'S HOUSE SO THAT MASTERS,

WHO WAS INDISPOSED, COULD COMPLETE THE NEEDED NUMBER.

COLONIAL RULES WERE STRICT. MEMBERS WHO EVENTUALLY EARNED SIX

SHILLINGS A DAY FOR THEIR SERVICES, COULD BE FINED FOR MISSING A

SESSION OR FOR BEING IMPOLITE TO ANOTHER MEMBER. DURING THE FOURTH

ASSEMBLY, NICHOLAS MORE, A FORMER SPEAKER, WAS IMPEACHED FOR OFFENSES

INCLUDING CALLING A FELLOW MEMBER A "MAN OF FEDITIOUS SPIRIT".

UPON ELECTION OF A SPEAKER, THE ASSEMBLY ACCOMPANIED THEIR

CHOICE TO THE GOVERNOR'S CHAMBER FOR HIS APPROVAL. HERE THE SPEAKER

WOULD FOLLOW A BRITISH HOUSE OF COMMONS TRADITION OF "DISABLING",

PROCLAIMING HIMSELF UNFIT FOR THE POSITION AND PETITIONING THE GOVERNOR

TO HOLD A NEW ELECTION.

THIS PRACTICE CONTINUED IN PENNSYLVANIA LONG AFTER IT DIED IN

ENGLAND, UNTIL IN 1738 ALEXANDER HAMILTON TOLD THE GOVERNOR THAT

AFTER EIGHT SUCCESSFUL TERMS AS SPEAKER, HE COULD NOT HONESTLY

PROTEST THAT HE LACKED THE ABILITY FOR THE OFFICE. A FEW YEARS

LATER, JOHN KINSEY INFORMED THE GOVERNOR THAT HAVING WON THE HONOR,

HE FULLY INTENDED TO KEEP IT.

PENN WAS FOND OF SAYING THAT WHERE MEN CAN REASON TOGETHER,

THEY CAN RECONCILE THEIR DIFFERENCES, OR IF THEY CANNOT, THEY CAN

LIVE TOGETHER AMICABLY.

THIS PHILOSOPHY IS WHAT MAKES OUR GOVERNMENT WORK. A GROUP

OF MEN AND WOMEN ELECTED BY OTHER MEN AND WOMEN -- EACH AND EVERY

PERSON WITH THEIR OWN IDEAS AND NEEDS -- TRYING TO RESOLVE THEIR

DIFFERENCES AND STILL LIVE IN FRIENDSHIP. RESPECT FOR EACH

OTHER'S OPINIONS IS THE KEY; IT HAS KEPT THE SYSTEM WORKING FOR

300 YEARS. RALPH WALDO EMERSON EXPLAINED THE VALUE OF RESPECTING

OTHER'S DIFFERENCES THIS WAY. "NEVER TRY TO MAKE ANYONE LIKE

YOURSELF, BECAUSE YOU KNOW AND GOD KNOWS THAT ONE OF YOU IS ENOUGH."

I'M NOT SURE PENN'S HOLY EXPERIMENT TURNED OUR QUITE THE WAY HE HOPED. HE THOUGHT THAT THE LEADERS OF PENNSYLVANIA WOULD ALWAYS PUT THE PUBLIC GOOD ABOVE INDIVIDUAL OR REGIONAL CONSIDERATIONS. HE BELIEVED THAT SINCE THESE LEADERS WOULD BE CHOSEN BY THE PEOPLE THAT EVERYONE WOULD AGREE TO THEIR DECISIONS GLADLY. THE RESULT, HE EXPECTED, WOULD BE A STATE ENTIRELY FREE FROM CONFLICT. PENN'S VISION WAS SO IDYLLIC, IN FACT, THAT HE BELIEVED THAT PERSONS WHO THRIVED ON DISCONTENT SUCH AS CLERGY, LAWYERS OR WRITERS WOULD BE FORCED TO ABANDON THEIR PROFESSIONS OR LEAVE PENNSYLVANIA. WHAT HE GOT INSTEAD WAS A COMPETITIVE FREE ENTERPRISE SYSTEM AND THE RISE OF INDIVIDUALITY. HE DIED A DISAPPOINTED MAN ACCUSING HIS CITIZENS OF PLAYING "THE GREAT GAME OF CHEAT THE GOVERNOR".

YET PENN'S MOST CHERISHED VALUES -- FRIENDSHIP AND FREEDOM -HAVE STAYED ALIVE FOR THREE CENTURIES. TODAY, AFTER 300 YEARS OF
EXPERIMENTATION, WE CAN TRULY CALL THIS A CELEBRATION OF FRIENDS. IN
THE WORDS OF OUR MENTOR:

"I WISH YOU ALL HAPPINESS HERE AND HEREAFTER...

HARRISBURG (March 4) -- Proclaiming March 14, 1981, as "Charter Day" in commemoration of the founding of Pennsylvania 300 years ago by William Penn, Gov. Dick Thornburgh today called upon all citizens of the state, young and old, to join together in an 18-month, statewide "Celebration of Friends" in honor of Pennsylvania's 300th birthday.

The 18-month period denotes the first two important milestones in Pennsylvania's history: the granting of the Charter to Penn by England's King Charles II in March, 1681, and Penn's arrival in the Commonwealth aboard the ship, "Welcome," in October, 1682.

The governor also unveiled a theme and a logo for the celebration which depicts a stylized map of Pennsylvania formed by two hands clasped in friendship, under the slogan, "A Celebration of Friends," and over the phrase, "Pennsylvania's 300th Birthday."

"No other state can match Pennsylvania's three centuries of historical, social, economic and religious contributions to this country," said Thornburgh. "From its founding 300 years ago as a 'Holy Experiment' in religious freedom to its role a century later as this nation's 'Birthplace of Independence,' the contributions of Pennsylvania and Pennsylvanians have truly served as a keystone to our country's existence and growth."

Thornburgh said the celebration has been carefully designed "to involve the greatest number of Pennsylvanians possible," but at a modest expenditure of taxpayers' dollars in keeping with the "need for fiscal austerity in these difficult economic times.

"Our plans call for involvement and participation by the greatest number of Pennsylvanians possible," the governor said. "We are inviting all Pennsylvanians -- senior citizens and school children, Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts, people of every religious and ethnic persuasion from every city, town, borough and farm, everyone -- to join together under the banner of 'A Celebration of Friends' and commemorate Pennsylvania's 300th birthday in any manner they deem appropriate."

Thornburgh said the state is providing "an innovative, flexible

umbrella, a banner under which any local government, organization or individual can stage an appropriate celebration in a way we hope will encourage grass-roots participation."

For that reason, he said, the state has planned no major events of its own, but will provide guidance and coordination for events which others may develop.

"Indeed, if an organization wishes to observe the 300th anniversary of an important milestone in Pennsylvania's history which occurred after the Oct. 1684 date -- and there are many -- that's fine, too, " the governor said. "A true 'Celebration of Friends' should continue until the people decide its over, not the government."

The governor said that a special 300th Birthday Celebration office has been established in the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission which will:

*Serve as a clearinghouse for all 300th birthday activities throughout the state and provide guidance to those who reguest it.

*Assist groups and communities in obtaining promotional exposure for local events.

*Provide for posterity a public and permanent record of all 300th Birthday events, activities and observances.

*Develop appropriate strategies to promote a few select statewide observances.

*Assist all state departments and agencies in developing 300th Birthday observances and activities within the framework of existing departmental programs.

Under the last item, Thornburgh said he was requesting all state departments and agencies to designate a liaison at the deputy secretary level to offer full cooperation in working with the 300th Birthday Celebration office in pinpointing ongoing and future programs which easily could be adapted to a 300th Birthday Celebration theme.

Commenting on the unique compatability of the state's travel and tourism slogan, "You've Got A Friend in Pennsylvania," and the 300th Birthday slogan, "A Celebration of Friends," Thornburgh said the birthday celebration is also an open invitation "to people everywhere to visit the friendly places and people of Pennsylvania."

The governor also invited Pennsylvanians to watch "Penn's Dream," a half-hour special on William Penn to be shown Thursday evening, March 5, on the Pennsylvania Public Television Network.



THE AUTHOR OF THOSE WORDS WAS CHRISTOPHER COLUMBUS,
WHO CREDITED HIS EXPOLITS TO A BELIEF IN DIVINE GUIDANCE AS HE
SAILED WESTWARD TOWARD THE NEW WORLD ON HIS SECOND GREAT VOYAGE.

"IN THE NAME OF GOD - AMEN" WERE THE WORDS THAT RANG

OUT FROM THE MOST FAMOUS SHIP IN AMERICAN HISTORY -- THE MAYFLOWER

A TINY VESSEL POWERED BY WINDS OFF THE GREAT DEEP, AS IT APPROACHED

THE SHORES OF NEW ENGLAND. SHE CARRIED A CARGO OF PROTESTANT

MEN AND WOMEN WHO CAME NOT AS POLITICAL PILGRIMS BUT AS

RELIGIOUS PILGRIMS.

THEY WANTED TO LIVE IN A PLACE WHERE THEY COULD WORSHIP

GOD ACCORDING TO THEIR OWN CONSCIENCES. WHEN THEIR LITTLE SHIP

SAILED WESTWARD INTO THE ATLANTIC, A NATION UNDER GOD WAS RIDING

INTO HISTORY.

A REMARKABLE SCENE IN THE HISTORY OF NATIONS WAS ENACTED

ABOARD THE MAYFLOWER WHEN IT DROPPED ANCHOR IN PLYMOUTH HARBOR

MANY WEEKS LATER. THERE, UNDER THE LOW-HUNG BEAMS OF THE CABIN,

A GROUP OF DETERMINED AND BELIEVING MEN COMPACTED TOGETHER TO BUILD

A GOD-RULED STATE. NOTABLE AMONG HISTORIC DOCUMENTS IS THE

MAYFLOWER COMPACT, THE FIRST INSTRUMENT OF GOVERNMENT IN THIS

LAND, ESTABLISHING THE BASIS FOR AN ORDERLY SOCIETY.

THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE WAS WRITTEN BY GOD-FEARING
PEOPLE, FOR IT AFFIRMS BELIEF IN A CREATOR WHO GIVE TO MEN "CERTAIN
UNALIENABLE RIGHTS," AND THOSE MEN WHO AFFIXED THIER
SIGNATURES TO IT DID A VERY COURAGEOUS THING. THEY LITERALLY
TOOK THEIR LIVES IN THEIR OWN HANDS, FOR HAD THE REVOLUTION, WHICH

THEY WERE ENCOURAGING, BEEN UNSUCESSFUL, THEY WOULD HAVE BEEN EXECUTED AS TRAITORS AND THEIR PROPERTY CONFISCATED. BUT, BELIEVING IN FREEDOM OF THE MIND AND OF THE SOUL, THEY PUT ASIDE THEIR FEARS AND STRUCK OUT FOR JUSTICE AND HUMAN VALUES WITH THESE FAMILIAR WORDS THAT ARE DEAR TO THE HEARTS OF US ALL.

"WE HOLD THESE TRUTHS TO BE SELF-EVIDENT, THAT ALL MEN ARE CREATED EQUAL; THAT THEY ARE ENDOWED BY THEIR CREATOR WITH CERTAIN UNALIENABLE RIGHTS AMONG THESE ARE LIFE, LIBERTY AND THE PURSUIT OF HAPPINESS."

MANY OTHER DOCUMENTS OF EARLY AMERICA CONTAINED HUMBLE,
DEDICATED REFERENCES TO ALMIGHTY GOD. TAKE, FOR EXAMPLE, THE
FIRST OFFICIAL GOVERNMENT PROCLAMATION OF THANKSGIVING ISSUED ON
NOVEMBER I, 1777, BY THE SECOND CONTINENTIAL CONGRESS, THIS
PROCLAMATION SET ASIDE DECEMBER 18 OF THAT YEAR AS A DAY OF SOLEMN
THANKSGIVING, PRAISE AND PRAYER PATIERNED AFTER THE FIRST INFORMAL
CELEBRATION OF THE PILGRIMS ON THE ANNIVERSARY OF THEIR FIRST
DESOLATE YEAR IN THE NEW WORLD.

"......IT IS THE INDISPENSABLE DUTY OF ALL MEN TO ADORE
THE SUPERINTENDING PROVIDENCE OF ALMIGHTY GOD; TO ACKNOWLEDGE
WITH GRATITUDE THEIR OBLIGATION TO HIM FOR BENEFITS RECEIVED, AND
TO IMPLORE SUCH FURTHER BLESSING AS THEY STAND IN NEED OF"

FROM THE PILGRIMS FLEETING PERSECUTION, TO REFUGEES
FROM HITLER'S MASS EXTERMINATION OF JEWS, MILLIONS OF PEOPLE
HAVE SOUGHT AND FOUND RELIGIOUS AS WELL AS POLITICAL HAVEN IN
AMERICA.

AMONG THE EARLIEST TO FLOCK TO OUR SHORES IN SEARCH OF FREEDOM OF WORSHIP WERE THE QUAKERS, WHO SETTLED IN PENNSYLVANIA; THE ROMAN CATHOLICS, WHO FOUND A NEW HOMELAND IN MARYLAND AND OTHER COLONIES; THE DUTCH PROTESTANTS, WHO BUILT NEW AMSTERDAM, WHICH LATER BECAME NEW YORK CITY; THE BAPISTS, WHO FOUND THEIR NEW HOME IN RHODE ISLAND. JEWS, AMISH AND MENNONITES ALSO WERE AMONG THE OPPRESSED WHO FOUND LIBERTY IN THE NEW WORLD.

MUCH OF OUR NATION'S GROWTH CAN BE ATTRIBUTED TO
RELIGIOUS LEADERS. METHODIST CIRCUIT RIDERS, MAKING THEIR
PREACHING ROUNDS ON HORSEBACK, HELPED TO OPEN THE MIDWEST.
ROMAN CATHOLICS CONTRIBUTED TO THE BUILDING OF THE FAR WEST.
PRESBYTERIANS AND CONGREATIONALISTS LAID THE FOUNDATION OF OUR
EDUCATIONAL SYSTEM.

WHEN WE REMEMBER THE ALAMO, WHERE DAVY CROCKET AND JAMES BOWIE DIED BEFENDING TEXAS AGAINST THE MEXICANS, WE SHOULD ALSO REMEMBER THAT THE BUILDING WAS NOT A FORT -- IT WAS A CATHOLIC MISSION.

INDEED, AMERICA HAS HAD A UNIQUE BACKGROUND OF FAITH
FROM ITS VERY BEGINNING. NO OTHER NATION HAS ROOTS SO STEEPED
IN THE COMMITMENT OF RELIGIOUS FREEDOM -- THE FREEDOM TO SEEK AND
FIND EQUALITY BEFORE GOD UNDER THE ESTABLISHED GOVERNMENT.

WE CAN SEE EVIDENCE OF THEIR RELIGIOUS FREEDOM TODAY

BY MERELY REACHING INTO OUR POCKETS. OUR MONEY CARRIES

THE MOTTO "IN GOD WE TRUST". SESSIONS OF CONGRESS AND

THE SUPREME COURT OPEN WITH A PRAYER. A CAPITOL PRAYER ROOM

IS MUCH USED BY LEGISLATORS. EVERY PRESIDENT TAKES HIS OATH

OF OFFICE ON THE BIBLE. WITNESSES SWEAR ON BIBLES IN COURT

PROCEEDINGS.

AMERICA HAS HAD FOUR EXTRAORDINARY CRISES DURING ITS
HISTORY. IN MY HUMBLE OPINION, THE FOURTH CRISIS IN AMERICAN
HISTORY IS THE CRISIS OF THE PRESENT MOMENT. OUR NATION IS
BEING THREATENED TODAY AS IT HAS NOT BEEN THREATENED SINCE THE
CIVIL WAR. IT IS NOT THAT WE ARE MENACED BY COMMUNISM, ALTHOUGH
THAT DANGER IS WITH US FROM WITHIN AND WITHOUT. SOME THING EVEN

AND TRUTHFULNESS HAVE BEEN THROWN OUT THE WINDOW. THE UNITED
STATES OF AMERICA IS ONE MAD WHIRL OF AMUSEMENTS AND PLEASURE
AND LICENTIOUSNESS AND IMMORALITY. JUVENILE DELINQUENCY IS
MOUNTING SO RAPIDLY WE CAN'T KEEP PACE WITH THE FIGURES.

THE DRUG MENACE, FAR FROM DECREASING IS INCREASING AND CLAIMING NEW YOUNG VICTIMS EVERY DAY. THE LATEST FBI CRIME FIGURES ARE SHOCKING; A 12 PERCENT INCREASE IN VIOLENT CRIMES. CHRONIC ALCOHOLICS NUMBER AT LEAST SIX MILLION.

DURING THE LAST DAYS OF THE EMPIRE ARE NOW OBSERVED AND FELT
IN OUR SOCIETY. DIVORCE RATES ARE INCREASING. RACIAL TENSIONS
ARE WORSE, NOT BETTER. INFLATION IS SIPHONING OFF THE SAVINGS
OF THOSE WITH LOWER INCOMES. POLITICAL ISSUES ARE DIVIDING US.
CONFIDENCE IN GOVERNMENT HAS BEEN SHAKEN. WALK DOWN THE STREETS
OF OUR CITIES AND READ THE NAMES OF THE LATEST FILMS ON THE MARQUEES.
MOST OF THE FILMS DEAL WITH SEX, CRIME, AND ABNORMAL BEHAVIOR.
ONE CAN ONLY ASK, WHAT IS THE COUNTRY COMING TO?

IT IS HOPED THAT MY PRESENCE HERE TONIGHT MAY SERVE

AS A REMINDER TO ALL WITHIN MY VOICE OF OUR PRECIOUS HERITAGE AND

AWAKEN IN EVERY MAN AND WOMEN, BOY AND GIRL, THE DETERMINATION

TO KEEP IT ALIVE FOREVER.

TO ACCOMPLISH THAT, VIGILANCE IS ESSENTIAL LAXITY ON OUR PART COULD RESULT IN GENERATIONS OF YOUNG PEOPLE GROWING UP UNFAMILIAR WITH THE FIRM MORAL FOUNDATION UPON WHICH OUR COUNTRY RESTS. THE PRESENT IS FULL OF THE PROBLEMS AND NEEDS OF THE "NOW" GENERATION, YET OUR NATION IS WHAT IT IS BECAUSE OF WHAT IT HAS BEEN, TOGETHER WITH WHAT MAN WANTS TO MAKE IT.

IT IS IMPORTANT, THEREFORE, NOT ONLY THAT OUR YOUTH BUT
OUR OLDER GENERATIONS AS WELL, REMAIN AWARE OF THE PRINCIPLES THAT
HAVE MADE THE UNITED STATES UNIQUE. IMPORTANT IN THIS CONTEXT
ARE THE WORDS OF THE GREAT QUAKER, WILLIAM PENN:

"UNLESS WE ARE GOVERNED BY GOD, WE WILL BE RULED BY

TYRANTS. THE MEN AND WOMEN WHO BUILT AMERICA HAVE BEEN

MOTIVATED -- AND IN TURN HAVE MOTIVATED OTHERS -- BY A SPIRITUAL

ZEAL THAT CONTINUES TO INFLUENCE THE CHARACTER AND PURPOSE OF OUR

LIFE TODAY."

IN MY HUMBLE OPINION, THE GREATEST NEED TODAY IS NOT
FOR MORE GUNS OR MORE ATOMIC BOMBS. IF WE GO BACK TO THE REIGN
OF KING SOLOMON IN ISRAEL ABOUT 350 B.C., AS GIVEN US IN II
CHRONICLES, WE FIND THAT WHEN THE PEOPLE WERE FAITHFUL TO THE WORSHIP
OF GOD AT THE TEMPLE, THEY PROSPERED, AND WHEN THEY BECAME CARELESS.
THE NATION HAD TROUBLE. AFTER SOLOMON FINSIHED THE HOUSE OF THE

THAT THERE IS NO RAIN, OR COMMAND THE LOCUST TO DEVOUR THE LAND,
OR SEND PESTILENCE AMONG MY PEOPLE, IF MY PEOPLE WHO ARE CALLED
BY MY NAME HUMBLE THEMSELVES, AND PRAY AND SEEK MY FACE, AND
TURN FROM THEIR WICKED WAYS, THEN I WILL HEAR FROM HEAVEN, AND
WILL FORGIVE THEIR SIN AND HEAL THEIR LAND."
