I am pleased to inform you that a grant will soon be awarded to the Butler County Conservation District under the Environmental Stewardship and Watershed Protection Grant Program (Growing Greener).

The grant of \$8,389 will be used to complement local watershed-based conservation efforts in the Connoquenessing Creek watershed. Soil fertility testing will be provided to about 40 farms covering 2,000 acres as a tool to educate farmers on proper soil nutrient management for water quality protection. Soil test results will be compiled to create a soil fertility index for the watershed.

Dear Mr. Travaglio:

In case you were not aware, Buffalo & Pittsburgh Railroad, Inc. from your district applied for funding under the first funding round of the 2000 Rail Freight Assistance Program (RFAP).

On behalf of the Ridge Administration, I am pleased to inform you that Buffalo & Pittsburgh Railroad, Inc. was selected to receive funding in the amount of \$299,988. A total of 78 applications were received during the first funding round of this year's program with a total project cost exceeding \$21 million and a requested state share exceeding \$12 million. Approximately \$7 million was available and we were able to fund 45 of the 78 applications that were competing for funding under round one. We have notified Buffalo & Pittsburgh Railroad, Inc. of their grant award.

Information provided by the applicant reflects that this rail freight project will support economic growth as well as help reduce congestion on our crowded highways. As a result of this project being completed, 16 jobs will be maintained and it is anticipated that over the next three years, highway congestion will be reduced by approximately 21,645 truck trips per year in your district. This project will help the Commonwealth improve its overall transportation system, always with a focus on meeting shippers and receivers' "just in time" transportation requirements.

We appreciate the role you play in providing for a more efficient transportation system, and the contribution you make toward economic growth in the Commonwealth. The Pennsylvania American Water Company (PAWC) plans to bring public water service to Zelienople Borough and Jackson Township in Butler County.

Presently, Zelienople Borough Water Authority is in the midst of a crisis. They are unable to supply drinkable water to their consumers due to the high nitrate content in the Connoquenessing Creek resulting from the water discharge of A.K. Steel. PAWC's plan to build a back-up water system would: help eliminate the current water crisis that is experienced during the Summer and Fall in Jackson Township and Zelienople Borough; help prevent the loss of A.K. Steel and thousands of jobs in this region, and; encourage developers – specifically, the Stonewall Business Park and the Butler Auto Auction. These two projects' viability hinge on the ability to bring public water to Jackson Township.

PAWC's plan to bring public water to Zelienople Borough and Jackson Township will provide unique economic and social benefits to the community through the proposed developments and also serve to correct the serious water crisis that exists at present.

I would like to take this opportunity to highly support Pennsylvania American Water Company's proposal and would respectfully request favorable consideration of PENNVEST funding to assist in this endeavor.

Dear Chairman Evans:

Museums throughout the State rely on State dollars in their efforts to preserve local history. Many of these institutions are vital segments of our county's tourism initiative, and many of them add to the quality of life in our areas and provide educational services to our communities.

The Butler County Historical Society depends on State monies to offset salaries - an expense rarely covered by admissions and rarely funded by private donations. State monies enable the Society to employ a professional staff, thus improving the quality and quantity of services offered to our community.

The Governor's announcement of static funding of \$4.45 million for the line item appropriation to the Museum Assistance Program maintains funding at a level which will be insufficient to provide assistance to the increasing numbers of museums applying for grants.

The Butler County Historical Society respectfully requests an increase in the Museum Assistance line item from \$4.45 million to \$6.0 million, and I highly endorse this increase in this line item appropriation.
